Dear Mr. Adams,

The Los Angeles River is a wonderful, and often underutilized resource which our board takes a keen interest in given its proximity to much of Griffith Park. Griffith Park Advisory Board (GPAB) was fortunate enough to receive a presentation from LADOT three years ago that detailed initial plans for this proposed phase (IV) of the LA River Bike Path. We are encouraged to see how this project has evolved through the valuable community feedback from various stakeholders since then. Our board, guided by the Vision for Griffith Park, are large proponents of active transport and have worked hard to shepherd initiatives that hope to expand active transport in and around the park.

As we have continued to monitor the development of this phase of the river project, and listened to feedback from various park user groups, we have some concerns about the CEQA Initial Study's conclusion that this meets a Mitigated Negative Declaration, and think that more analysis needs to be done.

- We have heard feedback from other notable stakeholder groups and organizations that they feel the 30-day comment period for the IS/MND has been too short. Extending the comment period would provide these organizations more time to adequately evaluate these documents and provide more detailed feedback.
- One of the largest areas of concern is regarding necessary tree removal and the ability to adequately mitigate this. The project will require the removal of existing and mature trees on both public ROW (owned by the Department of Recreation and Parks) and CalTrans ROW. Of the combined 77 trees being removed, a total of 26 are protected trees. While we understand there are mitigation measures available, the removal of this

many, particularly protected, trees is excessive. Three restoration sites are identified - "on-site where available", Bette Davis Picnic Area, and "Pump 7".

- We have yet to see the RAP Forestry Division's reviews of the matter and are very sensitive to any projects which potentially add undue stress or workload to RAP's already thinly-stretched department. In short, we are not convinced that this issue can be effectively mitigated to a less than significant impact, particularly as much of the mitigation efforts will fall upon RAP.
 - We are also concerned about who will ultimately be responsible for maintaining this stretch of the bike path. The draft IS/MND states that LADOT has committed to maintaining the entirety of phase IV - can we confirm that this is indeed that case for perpetuity? As stated, RAP's resources are thinly stretched; so, the prospect of adding yet another area that requires their attention and maintenance would provide undue stress.
- At our most recent board meeting we were fortunate enough to receive some updates from representatives from Council District 4. During this presentation we learned that CalTrans has won a grant to study numerous Freeway and Bicycle interactions, which will hopefully be completed later this year. As the project in question constitutes a closed loop for cyclists - where they must dismount, turn around, and return east when they reach the terminus of Phase IV - it brings into question whether this phase should proceed until it is clear what it will ultimately connect to.
- Similarly, as we consider the overall goal of the LA River Master Plan to have a unified connection for active transport along the entirety of the LA River, within the constraints of existing infrastructure challenges, it is not clear that this particular phase is best placed on the river itself until and unless we know what it will connect to. Does this create duplicative connectivity that is better served by bolstering active transport lanes within Griffith Park itself?
- While there has been some valuable engagement with the Equestrian Community, and they have been proactive in providing feedback, their uneasiness about the safety and effectiveness of this project are a major cause for concern
 - There isn't a clear consensus about what the most safe and effective design of the fencing should be. The community seems to be pretty split about whether the fencing should obstruct the view of oncoming traffic or not. Without consensus in design features, the project risks ending up a built feature that just isn't used - much like the North Atwater Bridge.
 - The project isn't clear about minimum widths for the equestrian trail. The virtual public meeting from March 12, 2025 suggests that the minimum width for the entire length is 10 feet; however, the Draft IS/MND says that there is one location where the width drops to 8 feet due to ROW constraints. The community's feedback has been absolutely consistent about minimum safe passing distance.

We appreciate your taking the time to listen to and address our concerns about the project as it currently stands. The goal of increasing active transport connectivity along the LA River is an excellent undertaking and one that we are generally in support of; however, we do question whether more analysis needs to be done before approving a final IS/MND.

Dear Commissioners:

I am writing on behalf of the Westwood Homeowners Association regarding the Westwood Recreation Center Park.(the"Park") seeking your leadership in addressing the need to activate our pickleball courts at the Park and to approve the proposed Westwood Garden Project for the Park.

This Park is an integral part of our community. In response for great demand that the Park convert at least one of the tennis courts to Pickleball Courts, Rec.and Park ("RAP") ultimately determined that two tennis court could be converted. The Los Angeles Tennis Centers, which manages the tennis courts submitted a proposal to convert two courts from tennis to pickleball, upgrade the courts and provide for management of the courts. Until the Palisades fire the Los Angeles Tennis Centers was providing those services in the Palisades. Much to the dismay of our community RAP turned down the proposal, merely restriped the courts and then did nothing further. No nets are provided. No programming is scheduled. As a result the only way a court can be used is if a group has their own net, and an arranged game. So instead of these courts being actively used, our community is still forced to go to Beverly Hills, Culver City or Santa Monica if they want to take advantage of the open play, drop in benefit that is afforded to players.

It is noteworthy that on July 18, 2024 RAP acknowledged to this Commission the new demand for pickleball and this Commission approved RAP's proposal regarding use and charges related to the pickleball courts. Nine months later, though RAP has a website that lists various parks that have Pickleball courts, when you access the website for any of those parks there is no mention of pickleball. So without going to the park there is no way any community member would know


anything about accessing a court. Whatever has caused this system to bog down, our community should not have to wait any longer to RAP to make sure that pickleball players don't have to go to other cities to participate in this sport.

The Westwood Garden Project proposal was developed by a member of the Park PAB in conjunction with master gardeners. A copy of the project proposal is attached. When implemented, this project would convert a portion of the park that is unusable into a wonderful garden experience.

As is noted, the proposal is the result of extensive community outreach, careful planning and an estimated budget. Both the Westwood Park Advisory Board and the Westwood Neighborhood Council unanimously approved this project in late 2023. Though it has been submitted to RAP, there has not been any response. We ask that this plan be approved and funds allocated to turn a concrete slab into space that will substantially enhance the Park and provide an important asset to our community.

We look forward to your assistance in having these matters addressed. We appreciate your help.

Project Overview

The Westwood Park Advisory Board (PAB) requests the development of a garden in Westwood Park. The PAB proposes developing a garden on approximately 1 acre in the northeast corner of the park (see Figure 1). This space is currently unused and is an excellent opportunity to improve the natural landscape of the park.



Figure 1. Proposed location of garden in Westwood Park

The concept of this project was a response to strong interest from the community to maintain the natural spaces of the park. Recent development of athletic facilities at the park has highlighted the need for open green space that facilitates inclusive engagement with the park. Primary motivation to develop a garden are to:

- Create an inclusive, open space for all ages and abilities.
- Re-engage community, activate an underused portion of park.
- Provide access to nature in dense, urban area.
- Promote health and wellness opportunities for the community.

The preliminary park design, developed by the Westwood Garden Task Force, is designed to:

- Create a “stroll” garden to enhance and connect existing walking paths and expand physical activity opportunities in the park.
- Establish a space to expand the local natural landscape to benefit local residents, birds, pollinators, and other local fauna.
- Create educational and outdoor programming opportunities for the community through signage and community engagement activities.

- Create opportunities to explore and discover local flora and fauna and support enjoyment of outdoor space.

Figure 2 illustrates a preliminary concept for the garden. The Westwood Garden Task Force can work with Rec and Parks landscaping staff to develop a detailed design that will meet the needs of the community and thrive in the proposed location.



Figure 2. Initial design concept for garden

ADA Compliance

This project will be designed to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act, and accessibility and inclusivity will be key design considerations. The garden will include features such as ADA compliant pathways, sensory stimulation, and ample lighting.

Community Outreach Activities

The garden project was initially considered at a Park Advisory Board meeting in January 2022. It was proposed through public comment as part of an effort to develop a park wish list. The concept of this project has since been through several layers of community outreach and input including:

- Discussion and public input at four PAB meetings.
- Planning, design, and engagement activities with volunteers from the community.
- Survey on community interest in a garden, distributed to the community via
 - Park email distribution lists

- Local homeowner's associations
- Flyers at the park
- Social media
- Presentation to the Westwood Neighborhood Council (WWNC)

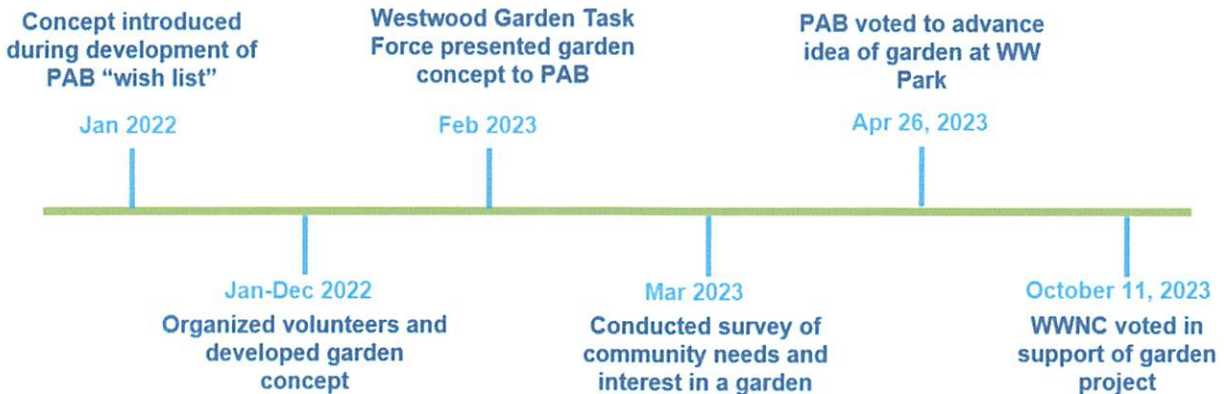


Figure 3. Community outreach activities for the garden

The survey results demonstrated strong support for a garden in the park. The WWNC voted unanimously in favor of this project on October 11, 2023. See Figure 3 for a timeline of the project concept and engagement activities.

Preliminary Project Budget

The Westwood Garden Task Force developed a preliminary budget (next page) for a garden with the following basic features:

- 1 acre in size
- Irrigation system
- ADA compliant walkways
- Hardscaping such as pathways, bioswales, signage
- Drought tolerant, California native plants, including mature trees
- Decorative features such as an entryway arch, benches, stepping stones, and boulders/stones
- Retrofit security/safety lighting

The final cost of the project will depend on the final design. The PAB intends to reduce costs of the project by working with a local nonprofit.

We propose short-term and long-term maintenance of this project using a combination of LA Rec and Parks maintenance personnel and community sources. We commit to establishing a strong Master Gardener presence at this garden to perform routine maintenance activities. We will develop regular volunteer-based maintenance programming that involves local residents and members of the larger community.

Kevin Altar

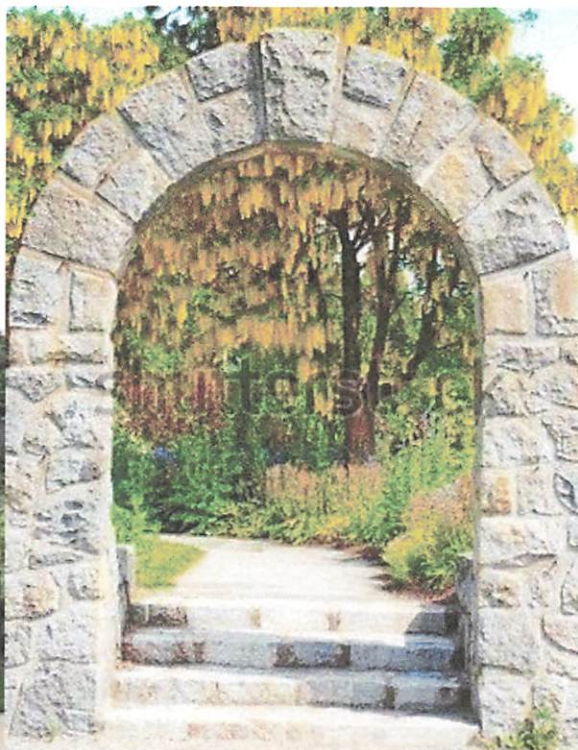
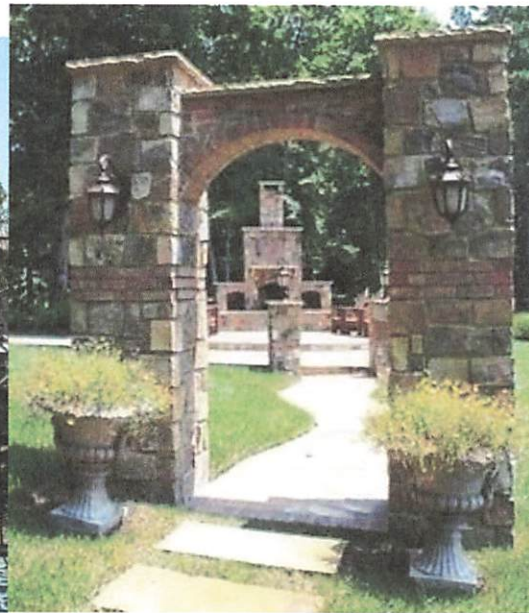
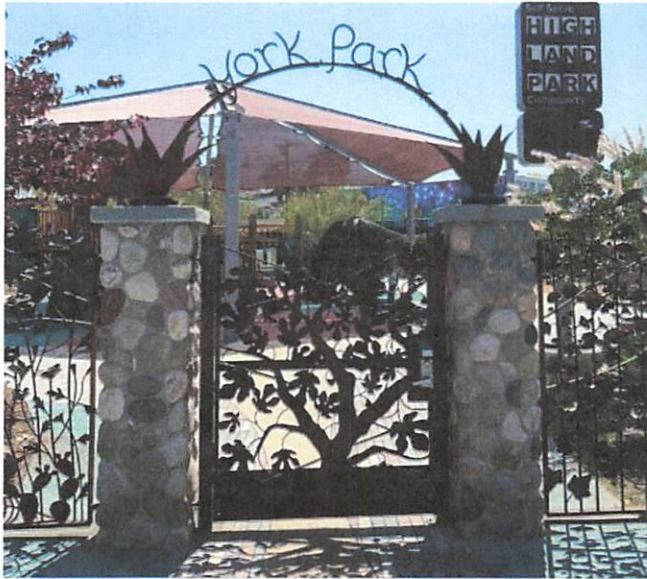

Dear Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners,

Like many of you, I am concerned about the looming budget constraints facing our parks.

With that in mind, I'd like to bring to your attention a proposal that not only offers significant revenue potential, but also addresses one of Griffith Park's most persistent challenges by elegantly capitalizing on one of its greatest opportunities.

My hope is that the RAP takes the lead on this project, as it would be its best opportunity to secure a share of meaningful, long-term revenue—that does not in fact directly encroach park land.

The proposed concept utilizes land owned by LADWP, the state, and the county, yet nevertheless directly impacts park patrons. While multi-agency collaboration is never simple, the upcoming LA28 Olympics create a unique window for innovation and cooperation, especially considering Olympics related regulatory easing. Additionally, this project could be structured to avoid the use of public funds, as prior proposals in this space have included offers of up to \$100 million in private financing.

I believe this idea aligns well with the Griffith Park Vision Plan as well as the City's broader transportation and infrastructure goals, including its Tourism Master Plan. I hope you'll find the concept a practical solution to a complex problem.

Project Benefits:

- **Fully within public right-of-way** – Minimizes legal and planning complexity.
- **Leverages existing infrastructure** – Begins at a freeway-adjacent, Metro-accessible parking lot with abundant daytime capacity.
- **Improves safety and accessibility** – Provides safe access to one of L.A.'s most visited recreational landmarks.
- **Protects natural habitat** – Avoids wildlife zones and ecologically sensitive areas.
- **Reduces congestion** – Eliminates visitor traffic in residential neighborhoods and improves emergency vehicle access.
- **High-capacity and ADA accessible** – Scales to meet existing and future demand.
- **Supports local businesses** – Connects visitors directly with the Hollywood Boulevard commercial corridor.
- **Equity-focused and family-friendly** – Increases affordable park access.
- **Educational potential** – A platform to teach visitors about the urban-wilderness interface and park rules.
- **Complements Metro's vision** – Aligns with potential K-Line northern expansion to Hollywood Bowl providing rail-to-trail transportation.

Project Overview:

An aerial tram to the main Hollywood Sign Vista—specifically, from the Hollywood Bowl parking lot to LADWP property adjacent to Lake Hollywood Park, and its close up views of the Sign.

Unlike earlier proposals, this newly identified route avoids costly technical obstacles and articulations, steers clear of private land, and other challenges like the high-voltage transmission lines that traverse Griffith park.

The starting point is the daytime underutilized Hollywood Bowl parking lot, located just a short walk from the Metro's Hollywood & Highland Station. The endpoint is along Canyon Lake Drive, on LADWP land adjacent to the park's most visited and photographically satisfying vista of the Hollywood Sign.

The current volume of private vehicle traffic to this vista is unsustainable, yet demand to see the Sign will continue to grow. This project offers a way to dramatically reduce car traffic in surrounding neighborhoods while greatly expanding access—for locals and visitors alike.

One of the world's leading aerial tram manufacturers has already provided preliminary positive feedback on the feasibility and cost-effectiveness of this short, direct alignment.

Lastly, it's an opportunity to deliver an experience worthy of our world-class city.

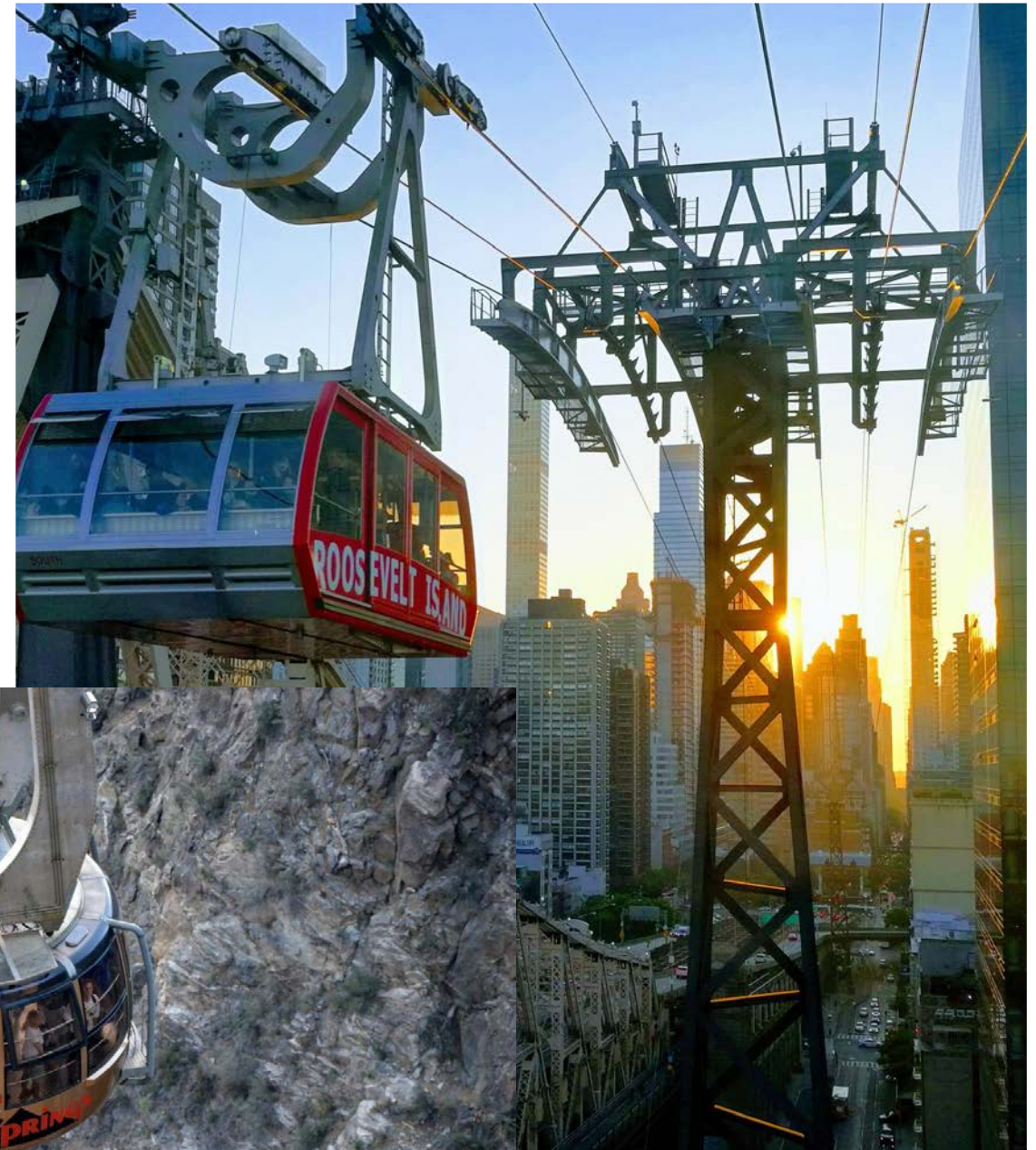

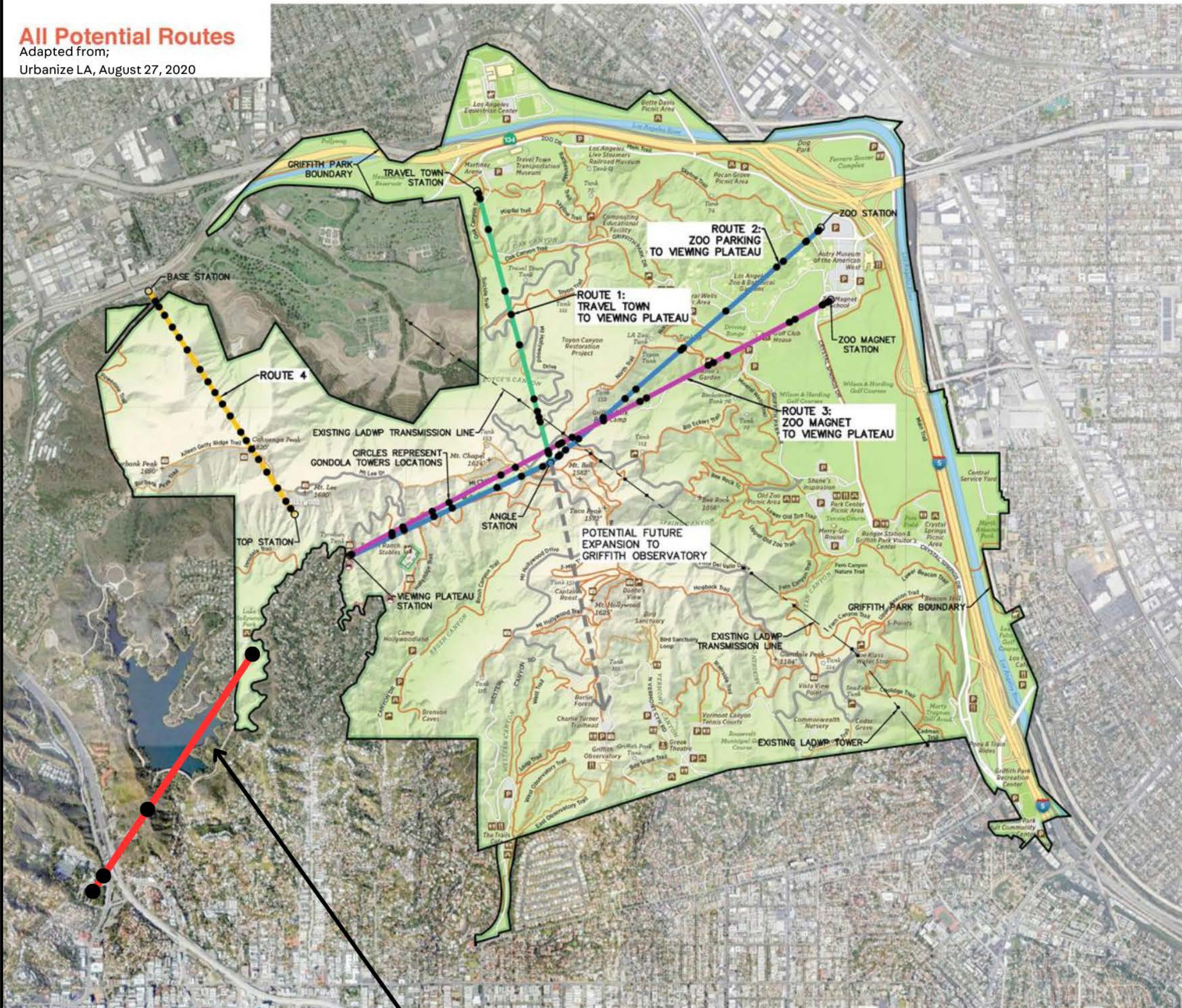

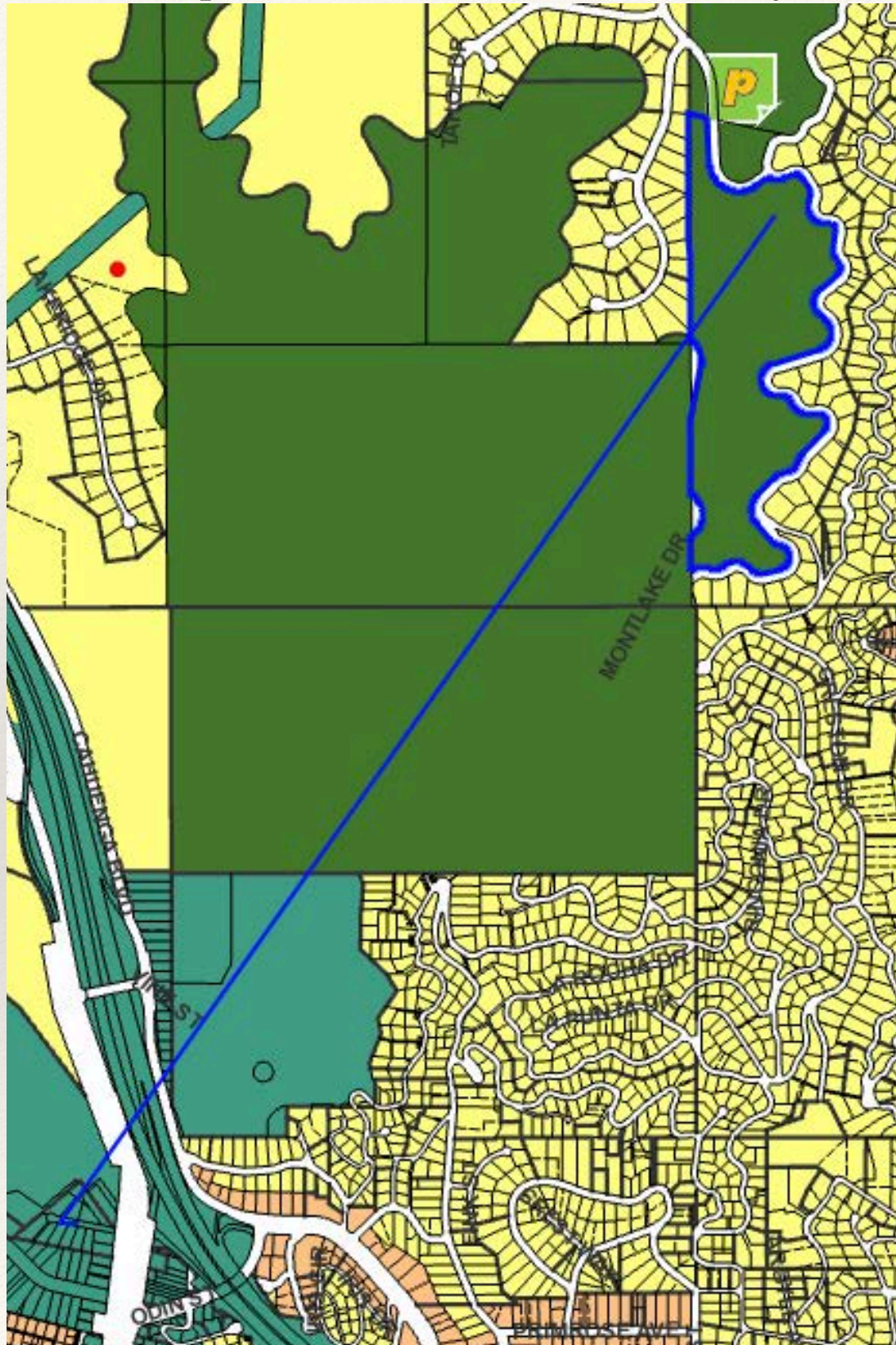

Members of CFAC spoke before you last year after Mariposa Landscaping ruined the Children's Arboretum in Eagle Rock by removing native shrubs from a designated planting area, a planting area that had been there for 20 years. CFAC later sent you a letter about this. We have not heard anything since....

We objected to Mariposa being considered for a renewed contract right after such destruction. We wanted to know how this will be resolved and assurances that this won't happen again. We were told to wait for the RFQ to be sure this won't happen again....

Mariposa Landscaping and Mariposa Tree Management is the SAME BUSINESS. Mariposa Tree did not complete their application, thus were not chosen under the RFQ, but Mariposa Landscaping did and have been awarded a contract. And what is WORSE is that you removed such an important qualifier, that "A C-61 license with a D-49 designation in good standing for five years is required if CONTRACTOR intends to bid on work involving trimming trees above 13 feet."

The next line reads *"The requirement for a C-61 license with a D-49 designation **has been deemed unnecessary** by operations staff for the requested services."* Pg 4 of the Board Report.

Although I am speaking on behalf of myself right now, I know I am not alone. I strongly object to this being removed from the RFQ and definitely OBJECT to Mariposa whatever shellgame they want to play, being chosen for the job. RAP should know better than this and be setting a higher standard, not lower, regardless of staff circumstances. Totally unacceptable..

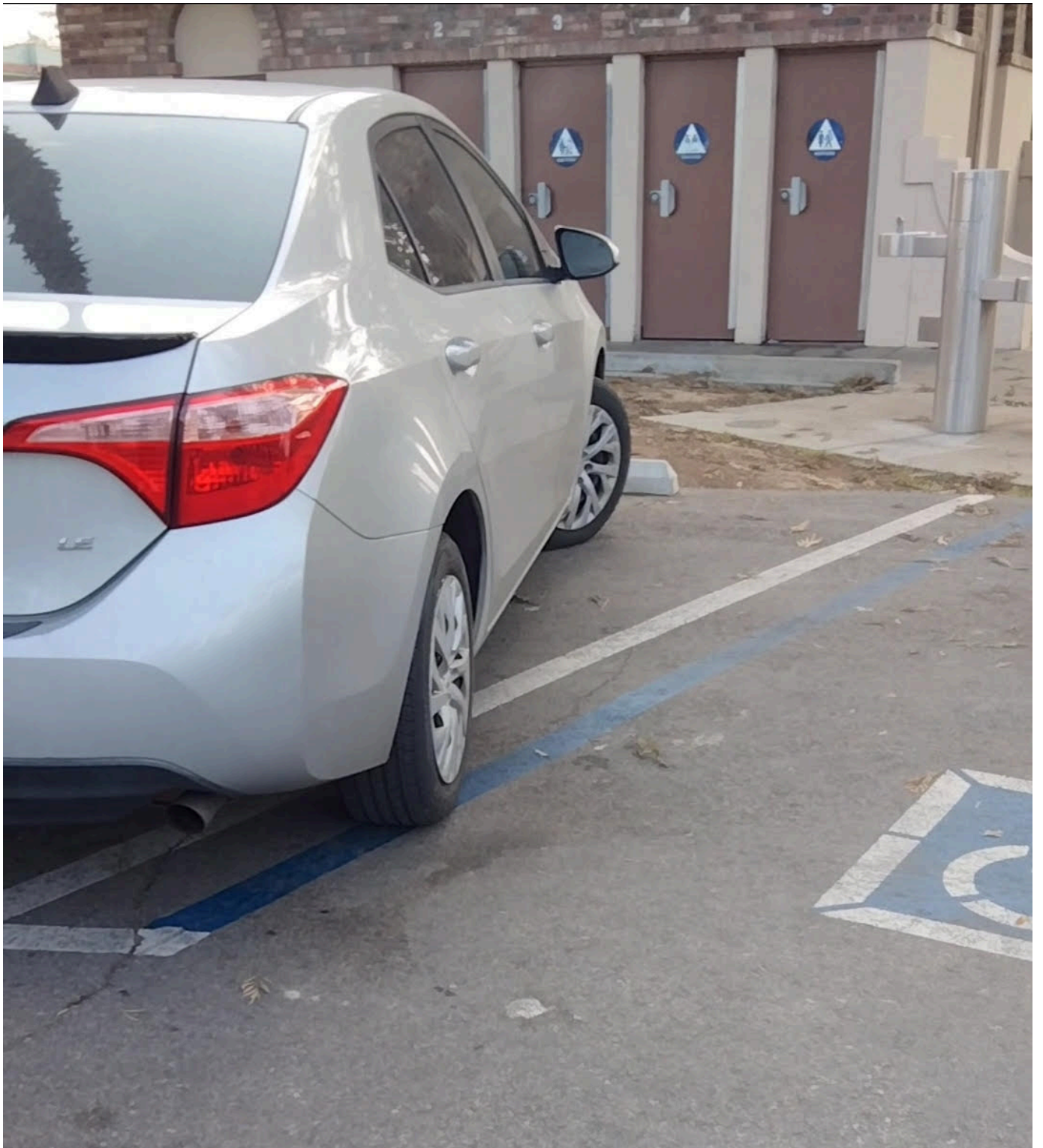
Please advise all public workers driving city vehicles not to break the laws. They should not feel they are above the law.

I am writing to express my deep frustration and disappointment with the current online registration system for LA Parks and Recreation programs. This morning, I attempted to register my child for summer camp at Glassell Park rec center online, only to find that the website crashed, making it impossible to complete the process. As a result, I had no choice but to come in person, only to find a line wrapped around the block. Some families had even camped out overnight to secure a spot—something that is simply not feasible for many parents, including those of us with young children.

This outdated and inequitable registration system puts families at a severe disadvantage, particularly those with work obligations, limited childcare options, or access barriers. The current process favors those who have the time and ability to wait in long lines, rather than ensuring fair and equal access for all members of our community. Additionally, the stress of this experience—combined with managing young children—makes what should be an exciting moment for families incredibly frustrating.

I urge the department to consider modernizing the registration system to make it more accessible and reliable. Implementing an interest form, improving website infrastructure to handle high traffic, or offering staggered registration windows could all help alleviate the issues we are facing. Families should not have to camp out or endure hours-long waits just to participate in community programs.

Thank you for taking the time to consider this concern. I appreciate the work LA Parks and Rec does to provide valuable programs, and I hope to see improvements that will make these opportunities more accessible for all families IN TGE COMMUNITY. I would love to hear if there are any plans to address these issues moving forward.

Thank you for your continued service to the City of Los Angeles and for taking the time to listen to residents like myself during yesterday's Board meeting at Stoner Park. Your commitment to hearing and supporting community voices is deeply appreciated.

As a member of the Park Advisory Board at Barrington Recreation Center, I want to reiterate a few of the key points I shared in my remarks.

Barrington Recreation Center is the only recreation center serving the Brentwood neighborhood—home to approximately 35,000 residents. Though modest in size, BRC has been a vital resource for the community, sustained over the years by incredible, dedicated leaders like **Daisy Gomez** and **Carlos Luna** with support from PAR leaders such as **Sonya Young-Jimenez**. Yet the facility has been chronically under-resourced and in serious disrepair for far too long.

The athletic field is uneven and hazardous due to gopher holes, patchy or absent grass, and persistent drainage issues. Our four tennis courts and outdoor basketball court are cracked and overused. The gym is outdated and only accommodates young children up to age eight with a single youth-sized court. We lack any multi-purpose space to host non-sport programming, especially when the gym is in use. The existing office space is extremely cramped and deteriorating. And our parking lot—limited to just 25 spaces—makes it nearly impossible to host games or events, contributing to a frustrating traffic burden as parents circle for parking or leave the area altogether to access programs elsewhere.

These limitations drastically restrict our ability to serve our community. The number of residents we can presently accommodate is low. Program offerings are limited by both space and condition. Families are forced to seek out other neighborhoods for activities, increasing car trips and congestion in an already traffic-challenged area. Seniors have no reliable space to gather. And because we cannot offer field or court access during unused hours to non-rec teams like club

soccer, AYSO, lacrosse, or field hockey, we lose a key opportunity to both serve more youth and generate revenue to support ongoing maintenance and staffing.

But just because Barrington is small doesn't mean it can't be extraordinary. With the support of this Board, all of these issues can be addressed—without a financial burden to the City, including ongoing maintenance cost assistance so that the revitalized Barrington Recreation Center remains in excellent condition for generations to come.

We are not asking for City funding. We are only asking for your support and partnership. In collaboration with the Los Angeles Parks Foundation—and with the support of Councilwoman Traci Park, the Brentwood Community Council, the Brentwood Homeowners Association, local businesses, and many other neighborhood stakeholders—we are ready to lead a fully community-funded revitalization effort.

We have already secured early commitments from donors and volunteers who are eager to invest in this vision. We have draft designs (**see select slides attached**), a phased construction plan, detailed budgets, and a working timeline—all of which we would be honored to share in detail with you. Our approach is designed to ensure no loss of existing programs or services during construction—only thoughtful and sustainable expansion with minimal impact to the environment, traffic and neighbors.

When complete, we expect the revitalized Barrington Recreation Center will be able to serve three to five times the number of residents it serves today.

Our plan includes (See attached layout):

- Revitalizing the athletic field
- Adding two new tennis courts
- Constructing a new gym with a full-size high school basketball court (which doubles as two youth courts)
- Tripling available parking to alleviate traffic and increase accessibility
- Adding new staff offices and storage
- Creating flexible, multi-purpose classrooms for art, dance, music, civic events, voting, indoor sports (yoga, martial arts, boxing, weight training, fencing) and many other youth and senior programs and activities (trivia, bingo, etc.)
- Additional trees, plants, gardens, and usable green spaces

Importantly, this revitalization will have no negative financial impact on the City. In fact, by improving the condition and capacity of the center, the project may ultimately reduce financial pressure by enabling expanded programming, increased participation, and increased revenue from rec center programs and permitted third-party use during off-hours.

We are prepared to begin work immediately and are confident **we can complete the entire project before the 2028 Olympics, with significant improvements completed ahead of the 2026 World Cup.**

This is a rare opportunity to transform a beloved but underutilized community resource into something that truly reflects the energy, diversity, and spirit of Brentwood—and that is open and accessible to all Angelenos.

All we ask is for your support and help in expediting the approvals necessary to bring this vision to life. We are ready to make this dream a reality.

Sometimes good things come in small packages. Barrington Recreation Center may be small—but with your support, it can become something truly great.

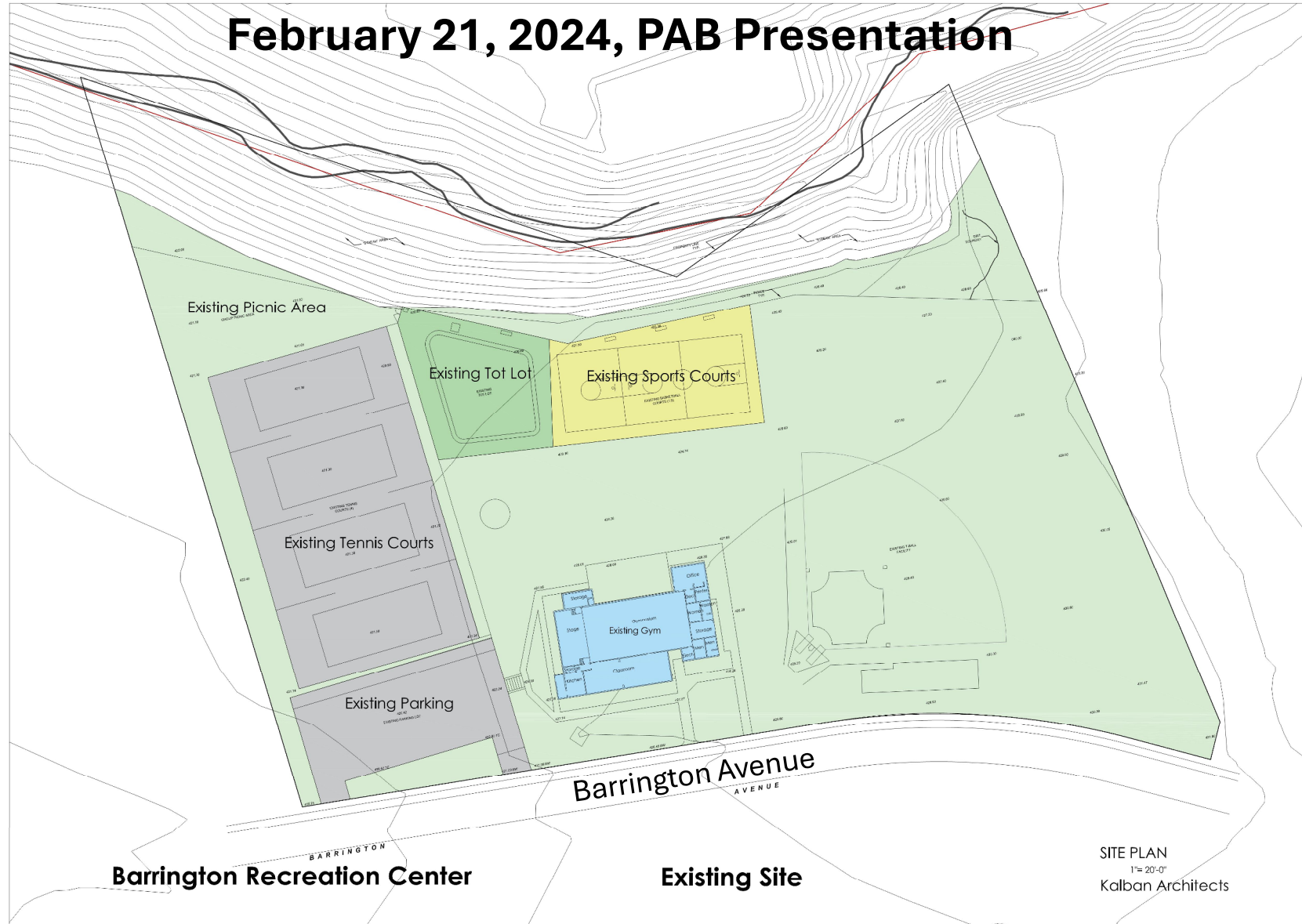

I am writing again in support of preserving our public tennis courts in Los Angeles, especially protecting them from possible conversion to pickleball.

I first wrote to you with a paper petition of hand collected signatures to protect the stadium court at Griffith Park/Riverside in October 2023. Then, when it seemed Echo Park Tennis Courts and other courts at Griffith/Riverside and Griffith/Merry-Go-Round were on the table for conversion, I started an online petition and wrote to your office again in December 2024. I and many other stakeholders have also called your main line and commissioners hotline to submit comments of concern.

I have yet to receive any direct reply from your offices regarding this issue but did appreciate learning about a community meeting being hosted tonight in Highland Park to discuss the city's plans to convert court #11 at Hermon Park to pickleball.

I and other petitioners will be in attendance this evening on behalf of the tennis community. We will present our concerns at that time, but I also wanted to send our petition via email in advance of the meeting.

This letter, and the attached **1859 signatures** currently collected via online petition at www.allfortennis.net, are in support of preserving all of our city's public tennis courts, including the 11 first-come-first-serve courts at Hermon Park. At the free courts at Hermon Park, there are always long wait times and lines during peak hours and weekends -- a testament to the high demand and need for accessibility to tennis courts.

As stated in the petition, we understand the need for pickleball courts, but we urge the city to find solutions that don't come at the expense of our well loved and highly trafficked tennis courts at Hermon Park.

We have recently learned of the city's plans to convert tennis courts at Riverside Tennis Court to pickleball courts.

This letter is in support of preserving all of the tennis courts at Riverside Tennis Court. Court 12, especially, is historic and significant to the tennis community for being the only standalone court with stadium seating that can accommodate tournament and/or other exhibition play. Permanently removing the bleachers and converting Court 12 to pickleball courts would be a mistake, and an enormous loss for Los Angeles' many tennis players and enthusiasts.

We are not against pickleball but urge the city not to take over existing tennis courts. Though we acknowledge that pickleball is experiencing a boom in popularity, participation in the sport should not come at the expense of tennis, an already popular sport that draws interest at every skill level, age and

background. Preserving Court 12 and others at Riverside ensures that Angelenos of all socioeconomic backgrounds continue to have access to play and compete in a sport that promotes physical and mental health, and that would otherwise be inaccessible without membership to expensive private clubs. During peak hours in the mornings, evenings and on weekends, publicly accessible and affordable tennis courts are already scarcely available. We urge you to find a separate solution for pickleball enthusiasts to avoid displacing tennis players citywide.

Please accept this letter and the attached signatures as formal petition against the City of Los Angeles allowing pickleball courts to permanently replace any existing tennis courts at Riverside Tennis Court/Griffith Park. To the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks; City Council and Neighborhood Council Members,

We the undersigned tennis players, recreationists, and community stakeholders urge the City of Los Angeles to halt the conversion of existing public tennis courts to pickleball courts.

Below are several key reasons why we advocate for the preservation of our tennis courts:

1. High Demand: Converting tennis courts into pickleball facilities may seem like a convenient solution for one growing sport, but it would displace tennis players

citywide, leading to increased overflow and longer wait times at nearby courts. During peak hours – mornings, evenings, and weekends – publicly accessible and affordable tennis courts are already in limited supply.

2. Preserving an Olympic Sport: The 2028 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles will notably feature tennis, not pickleball. It is vital that the city supports and preserves this Olympic sport at the recreational level. We would like to see the city make plans for improved maintenance and preservation of all tennis courts in Los Angeles, for both the upcoming Games and for current and future generations.
3. Noise Concerns: Replacing tennis courts with pickleball would increase noise pollution. According to one finding, pickleball “register[s] a decibel level of ~70 dBA at 100 feet from the court,” whereas “tennis is closer to 40 dBA.” In the same study, pickleball, with its “high pitch [...] frequency of ~1.2k Hz,” is likened to “the beeping noise from a garbage truck backing up.” (1)
4. A Balanced Approach to Recreation: It is essential that the city continues to support a variety of recreational activities. While we acknowledge the need for pickleball courts to accommodate the sport’s growing popularity, we encourage the city to explore alternative solutions, such as building new pickleball courts, or reactivating decommissioned (possibly indoor) city-owned spaces, to ensure both tennis and pickleball enthusiasts have access to the facilities they need. Expanding pickleball should not come at the expense of tennis, as this fosters unnecessary competition and tension between player communities.

We represent a portion of the growing number of stakeholders opposed to the conversion of tennis courts into pickleball courts. With this petition, we seek your support in preserving and strengthening the sport we love, and securing its place in our city’s public parks.
