

Registration and Enrollment Information

Is my child ready for overnight camp?

In order to participate in our program, a camper needs to be able to move independently from place to place, meet their own personal care needs (i.e. tie shoes, brush hair, shower, etc.), and live cooperatively in a group cabin environment (which may or may not include cabin buddies).

<u>How to Register</u>

Please be sure to read, review, and understand all of our policies as outlined in this entire brochure before registering your daughter. Then, parents/guardians will be required to register online at https://www.laparks.org/camp/camp-hollywoodland and complete all required forms. All youth must be registered in advance to participate in our program. Onsite registration will not be accepted unless called off of the waiting list for attendance that day.

Completed applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. The rules of acceptance in the camp programs are the same for everyone, without regard to race, color, religion, or national origin. Persons with disabilities are welcome to participate in our programs. Reasonable accommodations will be made with prior arrangements.

Queue-it

Recreation and Parks is doing everything we can to improve the camp signup process, and in an attempt to make it as equitable and easy as possible, we have implemented a "Virtual Queue" on the first day of our summer registration. Here's how it works:

Registration is March 18th, 2025 at 11:00am, online only. On the day of registration, you can enter the online "waiting room" starting at 10:45 a.m. When registration officially begins at II a.m., everyone in the waiting room will be placed into the Virtual Queue in a random order to begin purchasing spots for Camp. A limited number of people will be allowed to register at once in order to keep the registration working smoothly, and more people will be let in from the queue every few minutes. The Virtual Queue will keep you up to date on your place in line.

Anyone logging on after registration begins at II am will be placed in the back of the Virtual Queue. Note: If you do not see a Virtual Queue it means that the maximum site visitors per minute has not been met, and therefore is not prompting.

Everyone who enters the waiting room between 10:45 am and II am will have an equal chance of being placed in the queue, so you don't need to worry about being the first person online.

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Waiting List

If a camp session fills, a waiting list will be started in the order in which completed applications are received. Parents will be notified when space is available in their child's age group. Payment is not required at the time of application submission for the waiting list. Cabin buddies are never guaranteed. When your child is called off of the waiting list, we have space in a specific cabin that may not be with your child's cabin buddy.

Late Fees

If room is available after the deadline (2 weeks prior to the start of the session), we will accept registration with a \$50 late fee. Registration accepted one week prior to the start of the session will be charged a \$75 late fee.

Changing Sessions

Request for changes of session will be accommodated if space is available. Fees will be charged per camper based on the earliest effected session as follows: I. With 2 weeks or more notice, \$50; 2. Less than 2 weeks notice, \$75. No change of session will be allowed for "No-shows". No session change will be made until a written request and appropriate fees are received. These fees are in addition to the difference in session prices where applicable.

Confirmation Packet

A confirmation packet will be available to download one month before summer camp begins. It will include several pages of camp information covering <u>health procedures</u>, <u>check-in and out procedures</u>, <u>rules of conduct</u>, <u>reasons for immediate dismissal</u>, <u>what to (and not to) bring to camp</u>, <u>spending money</u>, <u>mailing letters and other pertinent policies and procedures</u>.

Cancellations

All cancellations must be made in writing (e-mail is accepted). Refunds take approximately 6-8 weeks. The registration fees will be refunded as follows: I. Two or more weeks notice will be assessed a \$50 administrative fee, per session per camper. 2. Less than two weeks notice will be assessed a \$75 administrative fee, per session per camper.

Failure to cancel a session by the first day of camp at 8 a.m. will be considered a "No-Show" and NO REFUND will be issued.

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Introducing ePact

To ensure the safety and well-being of all campers, we are now using ePACT, a secure online emergency network, to handle much of our camp paperwork. It must be updated quarterly, but can carry your information over to save you time.

What is ePACT?

ePACT is an online system that helps us collect and manage emergency information for your child. It allows us to quickly access important details such as medical conditions, emergency contacts, and consent forms, ensuring we have everything we need to keep your child safe. Registration and fees will continue to be on LAParks.org; ePACT notifications will be sent after you have registered.

Why ePACT?

- Convenience: Complete and update your child's emergency information online, anytime, anywhere.
- Security: Your data is stored securely and only accessible to authorized camp staff.
- Efficiency: Streamlines the registration process, reducing paperwork and ensuring we have accurate information.

How to Register:

- Invitation: You will receive an email invitation from ePACT to create an account.
- Create Account: Follow the link in the email to set up your ePACT account.
- Complete Forms: Fill out the required emergency information and consent forms for your child.
- Submit: Once completed, submit the forms through ePACT.

Dropping Things Off / Showing Up At Camp

No one is allowed to visit camp during a session (including parents, relatives, friends). Coming to camp to drop something off for your child, or sending someone to do so, creates a security risk and can lead to homesickness among campers. If you do decide to come to camp without prior notification or arrangement with staff, you will be asked to take your child home with you at that time.


The Heart of Hollywoodland


Camp Hollywoodland is the best kept secret in Los Angeles. Offering swimming, crafts, cooperative living skills, nature awareness, field trips, and themed programs that include: meals, lodging, snacks, equipment and supervision.

What we do

The program schedule is from 7:30 am (rise & shine) until 8:30 or 9:30 pm. During the course of the day, campers will attend a variety of activities. (All activities are taught by trained and experienced staff.) Sessions begin Monday (Check-in is 8:00 - 9:30 AM) and end Friday (Check-out is 5:00 - 6:30 PM.)

Girls 6 -14 years old are divided into cabin groups with a 2 year age span (ages 6-8, 9-11, 12-14). Each cabin has 2-3 counselors that sleep in the cabins with their campers. The counselor-camper ratio is set by the American Camp Association. A separate Camper Leadership Development (CLD) Program is available for 15-17 year old girls.





<u>Camper Leadership</u> <u>Development Program</u>

Girls 15-17 years old are eligible to register for Camp Hollywoodland's CLD Program.

This exciting program offers:

- *Guidance in working with younger campers;
- *Assisting with camp activities;
- *A place for teenage girls to work together and build friendships;
- *An extension of their camper experience;
- *A place to build a strong sense of self;
- *An opportunity to enhance leadership skills;
- *Prepare for future counselor opportunities.

Camp Staff

At Camp Hollywoodland, we believe that the camp experience shapes children's lives. Our program aligns with the <u>American Camp Association's</u> "7 Camp Outcome Domains", which are Friendship Skills, Responsibility, Independence, Family/Citizenship, Teamwork, Competence and Exploration. Keeping this in mind, all of our staff are of college-age and chosen for their communication skills, experience or training in child development, the ability to be excellent role models and desire to create these outcomes.


Our rigorous selection process follows the ACA guidelines and includes multiple interviews, references and a background check. Our staff members undergo a minimum of one week intensive training and are certified in CPR and Standard First Aid prior to the start of camp. During the camping season, our staff is continually evaluated and guided to enhance their skills. The relationship between a camper and their counselor is at the heart of our camp's success.

Qualification: Female, at least 18 years of age with a High School Diploma or equivalent (preferably one year of college completed), desire and ability to work with children, to teach activities and work outdoors, Certification in CPR and First Aid with the American Heart Association.





Activity Leaders!

Qualification: Any Gender, at least 18 years of age with a High School Diploma or equivalent (preferably one year of college completed), desire and ability to work with children, to teach activities and work outdoors, ability to lift 50 lbs., ability to work at heights of 40 ft. for extended periods of time, Certification in CPR and First Aid with the American Heart Association.

Cabin Buddies

Cabin Buddy requests have been an ongoing consideration for us. While we embrace the idea of campers requesting one cabin buddy to enhance their experience, we've noticed instances where some campers have sought multiple buddies, leading to complications when their requests couldn't be accommodated. This has occasionally caused challenges within cabin groups, where campers arriving alone may feel a bit disconnected.

We've observed that when campers arrive without preestablished buddy groups, it fosters a more inclusive environment. We recognize that camp can be a unique opportunity for campers to reunite with cherished friends or family members, so we will continue to honor single cabin buddy requests; requests of more than one cabin buddy per week will <u>not</u> be honored. Our aim is to ensure that everyone feels welcome and part of the camp community.

The Rules for Cabin Buddies

- I. Each camper is allowed to request one cabin buddy.
- 2. A camper may only request a cabin buddy in their own age group (6-8, 9-II, I2-I4). CABIN BUDDIES ARE NOT GUARANTEED.
- 3. In order for your request to be considered, the cabin buddy you requested on your child's registration form, must also request your child as their buddy on their registration form. It must be mutual to be considered as a cabin buddy request.
- 4. If more than one name is entered on the cabin buddy section of the registration form, all requests will be null and void and no cabin buddy will be granted.

At Camp Hollywoodland we believe that camp is an opportunity for campers to make new friends and try new things. Sending your child to camp without a cabin buddy allows them the freedom to do both of these things without judgment from someone who knows them in the outside world.


